## Interactive financial literacy module for students

The Investors Practice Track (IPT) is a fun, interactive program for middle schoolers - 6th through 8th grade - or early high school.

The Skate Park Investor Practice Track includes an interactive video game-type module that CPAs can use to lead the discussion of the value of saving, want versus need, the difference between short-term and long-term goals, and the definition of true wealth.
